
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- What messages have/will you communicate to students (directly or indirectly) in the Education and Training courses to encourage student interest and ignite a passion for education?

Core Idea

- thoughtful supports for students to reflect on and explore teaching




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Modeling asset-based thinking in an imperfect World

- 5. "Mr. ____ doesn't use any of the techniques we have discussed in this course. Does that mean he is a bad teacher?"




